Dear Parishioners,

From what I hear President Obama's speech to the youth of the country went down well. One response was that he was "inspiring". The White House will have to contend with a few million letters from school children now. I was a bit startled to hear that some parents, fearing political indoctrination, withdrew their children. I hope the content of the President's message waylaid that criticism. He said what every parent, what every teacher what every student wants and needs to hear. The novelty was hearing the President saying it to them in a personal way.

It is amazing how patient parents have to be at times. I came across the story of a parent, a Baptist pastor, was anxious about his son – who seemed to be skipping study, not reading his bible and letting his hair grow. The son approached him one day and asked him to buy him a car. "OK, son" the father said, "if I see you reading your bible a bit more and doing your home work, and if you get a hair cut, I might consider it". A few weeks went by and he noticed that his son was working harder at his studies, and reading the bible a bit more but nothing happened with his hair. The son came back to him and said "Dad, have I done enough to deserve a car? "Well son," the father said, "I notice you read the bible more, and you are studying more, but why have you not cut your hair? "Dad, I have been reading the bible," he said, "I notice people in the bible never cut their hair!?" "Son" the father replied, "did you notice that they walked wherever they went?"

"Pope Benedict XVI's message about the environmental protection, found in his new encyclical, 'Charity in Truth' has applications both in daily life and in the political arena, according to Catholic environmentalists. In particular, the pope's words anticipate an international meeting on climate change issues in Denmark in December. The Vatican and bishops around the world will be looking to see that it is a fair agreement – that it does protect creation, reducing greenhouse gases and such, but that people who are most impacted by climate change get enough support to overcome what's coming".
