Dear Parishioners,

I attended a seminar for clergy on the new Instructions on the Mass that are under consideration by the Vatican and might be upon us by 2012. Our seminar was facilitated by Dr. Paul Ford. There are some very challenging aspects.

More singing is strongly recommended. Very simple chants are being prepared. Dr. Ford suggests that if you can hold a tune like “Happy birthday to you” you will be able to learn to sing the responses. Responses like “Alleluia” need to be sung. This seems to be the tradition already established here in St. Dunstan’s. But in general Catholics do not have a reputation for (hymn) singing.

We were referred to a very instructive article by now Cardinal Albert Vanhoye about the Common and Ministerial Priesthood. By our baptism we are all priests. We share in the priesthood of Christ. Ministerial priesthood signifies Christ’s mediation. “Ministerial priesthood is, in a sense secondary. For it is not the goal, but the mean between real existences (Christ and Christian); it is called ministerial precisely because it is subordinated to the service of these priesthoods. Apart from Christ’s priesthood, it has no value or content; apart from the common priesthood, it has no meaning or use”. I found Cardinal Vanhoye’s reflection very enlightening. If anyone is interested in reading it I can email it to you.

The most challenging aspect are the new translations of the mass that are being proposed. The translations that we use now are referred to as “translations with “dynamic equivalence” to the Latin text. The new translations are insisting on a more “formal equivalence”. So, when the priest says “The Lord be with you” the new response will be “And with your spirit”. This response is a more literal translation of the Latin “Et cum spiritu tuo” The argument is that as we got used to the first translation from the Latin we will in very short time get used to the new. That may be so.

When it comes to the Eucharistic Prayer – instead of using the word ‘cup’ we have to use the word ‘chalice’. “Take this all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me”.

The formal translation of the Latin “pro multis” is “for many”. The ‘dynamic equivalent’ translation is “for all”. True you can get used to everything, but did Jesus die for all or did he only die for many? If he died for all, then why not say what we mean? Hopefully the Bishops will make some exceptions in their desire for translations of formal equivalence”. - Fr. Casey
