Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we welcome Fr. John Fitzpatrick back on **the staff**. Fr. John soldiered with me in St. Athanasius for eight years. Before that he worked for thirty years or so in Brazil and a few years in Ireland. In the meantime Fr. Joe is on vacation in his home town in Ireland. He will make his 92 year old mother very happy. He will be back with us around December 1st. Whether he will be on the staff or just residing here is still being negotiated. Fr. Jim has had successful knee surgery. He will be running around here in about six weeks or so. For the time being we are not short of priests!

We are still recovering from **the Festival**. I was truly astonished at the commitment, interest and hard work that went in to make the Festival happen. I want to thank everyone: committee members, parents, school children and the wider community for their support and participation. The final financial tally has not been completed yet. The sense is that the economic down turn in the country is affecting support for charitable causes.

October was Pro-Life month. A parishioner expressed disappointment to me that there was not much mention of abortion in the preaching or the prayers during the month. That may be the case – however last weekend the Social Awareness Committee did mention that Pro-life was one of the issues that they are concerned with. We have a Rachel Project in the parish where women in want of counseling have access. It is good to be aware that there is a program that women who want to hand over the babies for adoption (no questions asked) is also available. We have an active prolife committee who keeps the issue alive. We are wounded but we want to keep trying.

Every day we pray to be “delivered from evil”. We pray to God for justice for the poor and the oppressed. We pray for the forgiveness of sin. Fundamentally our basic paradigm for sin is murder – Cain murdered Abel. We are told that the blood of the innocent cries out to God. We are a world with too many killing fields. However the borderline between the good and evil is not in some ‘other’ group or some distant place or some distant time. The frontier runs through the heart of every human being. We pray for salvation and deliverance from the sins of others, and from our own sinfulness.

We proclaim a gospel hope for every human being, including the unborn. In Luke’s blessings Jesus admonishes us “Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn others, or it will come all come back against you. Forgive others, and you will be forgiven... And why worry about the speck in your friend’s eye when you have a log in our own?” (Luke 6, 37-42) Jesus names those who condemn and refuse to forgive “hypocrites” (Luke 6.42).

In the daily struggle against evil take inspiration from the story of the Prodigal Son, the lost sheep, and the lost coin related in Luke 15. God is the shepherd, the woman, the Father who never gives up on or abandons the lost or the prodigal.

When you focus on the evil in the world, you replicate it. We must focus on the Gospel.
