## INTERNATIONAL RESTORATIVE JUSTICE SUNDAY

Today is International Restorative Justice Sunday. People all over the world are focusing on a Biblical form of justice that seeks to heal and restore the community instead of just punishing the perpetrators of crime. If a crime causes a wound, real justice should bring about healing. Healing the wounded and making the community whole again are the goals of restorative justice.

It's been pointed out by legal scholars, sociologists and religious leaders that our criminal justice system is grounded in retribution. Those convicted of crimes - especially violent acts - are to be locked away and punished by the government. Besides cooperating with the police and testifying in court, victims play no further role in the adversarial process. And rehabilitating offenders, at best, is an afterthought for the two million men and women incarcerated in the United States today.

Starting with their 2000 pastoral letter "Responsibility, Rehabilitation, and Restoration: A catholic perspective on Crime and Criminal Justice" U.S. Bishops have advocated for a more humane approach called "Restorative Justice" to repair the harm caused by criminal behavior to the extent possible. The growing social justice movement encourages victims, offenders and their impacted communities to fully participate in the healing process through victim/offender dialogue, restitution, victim and ex-offender assistance, and community service.

Crime is viewed as an offence against human relationships, so the focus is on healing. By participating in victim-centered programs, offenders see firsthand the impact of their crimes.

"Restorative Justice is about making everyone involved in crime whole again - victims, perpetrators and the community. The U.S. Catholic Bishop's statement talks about responsibility, rehabilitation and restoration.

The perpetrators have to take responsibility for their actions. Society also has a responsibility to try to restore the victims and the perpetrators. For perpetrators, rehabilitation means attending to addictions, unemployment and poverty or the lack of a moral or ethical base in the person.

For victims, restoration includes reestablishing safety, repairing injuries and repairing damaged relationships. The challenge of the Gospel message of forgiveness for victims is that it is in the act of forgiveness, difficult though it may be, that healing happens. A person who offends also has to have the grace and the capacity to ask for forgiveness. When these two things meet we have restoration. It's a difficult process. But the alternative is fear, hatred and divisiveness. The alternative is worse. It means the continual loss of human life". Auxiliary Bishop Gabino Zavala of Los Angeles.

Mother Teresa said, "All the problems of society stem from the fact that we have forgotten that we belong to each other". When we pray the Our Father we acknowledge that that we are all part of one family, God's family. Obviously there is a major break in our family when one member does violence to another member. When that happens we have a choice to make. We can either reject that person as a member of our family or we can heal the wounds and bring the family together again.

## TEMPORARY LITURGICAL MODIFICATIONS DURING FLU SEASON

In order to help prevent the spread of illness during the flu season, Archbishop Niederauer has directed that the following temporary changes be made in our liturgical celebrations.

- We are asked to stop the distribution of Precious Blood in the cup
- For better hygiene and out of consideration for fellow communicants, all are encouraged to receive communion in the hand rather than on the tongue. Persons who still wish to receive on the tongue will not be denied Holy Communion.
- The Sign of Peace should be offered without shaking hands
- We are asked not to hold hands during the "Our Father"
- Those who distribute Holy Communion should cleanse their hands with antiseptic solution before and after administering the Sacrament
- Ministers of the Eucharist who visit the sick and home-bound should observe these same precautions.

Please remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill. It is a sign of consideration for others that those with flu-like symptoms remain at home.

**These are temporary changes which are necessary to follow until the danger of flu season is passed.**

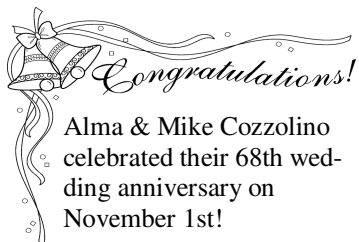
