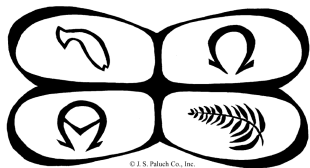
BAPTISM: Sundays at 12:30 pm preceded by instruction for the parents and godparents. Please call the rectory to register for classes.

Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

November 22, 2009

Jesus Christ is the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead and ruler of the kings of the earth. — *Revelation 1:5*

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING.

The title of 'King' is not one that springs to mind immediately concerning Christ. Nowadays, kings have a shady reputation and when you look back over history many of them were fairly manipulative and downright unjust in their dealings with their people, living in far removed palaces, unaware of the real concerns of the people they were meant to serve. Standing in front of Pilate, Jesus does not look like a powerful ruler. So Pilate asks him if he is a king. He answers yes, but not the type of king you are thinking of, with the trappings of power, financial wealth and probably corruption and violence as well.

Christ does not command armies. Once when Joseph Stalin was planning one of his outrages, an advisor said that the Pope would condemn his action. He answered: "The Pope? How many divisions (of troops) does he have?". Christ did not choose to be a king in a military or political sense – his model was the shepherd, who knows his sheep, who calls each one by name, who searches for the stray and who ultimately gives his life for his sheep. He came not to be served but to serve. He gave orders to nobody, gathered no taxes and showed little interest in getting to know the rich and influential. His throne was a cross. He was 'King of love on Calvary'. He had no palace - instead he walked among his people and now he dwells in the hearts of those who listen to his voice.

The kingdom of Christ is not a castle in the sky but something that should be deeply rooted within our hearts. We are called to be builders of this kingdom by carrying the word of God into an unbelieving world. This will involve being prepared to work for justice, love, forgiveness and peace. Being a voice for the voiceless will mean standing up and being counted. The values that govern his kingdom are glimpsed in the lives of people who spontaneously reach out with compassion to help the poor, the powerless, the vulnerable and those on the margins of society. Jesus spent much of his time with the sick and the infirm. He frequented the company of tax collectors, prostitutes and sinners. If we want to experience his kingdom, we have to go no further than outside our homes and make a visit to a nursing home, hospital or prison. This is where human need is greatest.

Today we acknowledge the Kingship of Christ. He rules not by fear. He forces himself on nobody. He does not rule over lands and territories. But he rules in the hearts of men and women who believe in him and follow him and thus make the world a better place. To us who accept his offer of life and grace, he is a good shepherd who cares for us, watches over us and bestows on us a power that no one else can give. There are other good people who don't know him but live by his standards; they live lives of justice and love. He is their king also.

TEMPORARY LITURGICAL MODIFICATIONS DURING FLU SEASON

In order to help prevent the spread of illness during the flu season, Archbishop Niederauer has directed that the following temporary changes be made in our liturgical celebrations.

- We are asked to stop the distribution of Precious Blood in the cup
- For better hygiene and out of consideration for fellow communicants, all are encouraged to receive communion in the hand rather than on the tongue. Persons who still wish to receive on the tongue will not be denied Holy Communion.
- The Sign of Peace should be offered without shaking hands
- We are asked not to hold hands during the "Our Father"
- Those who distribute Holy Communion should cleanse their hands with antiseptic solution before and after administering the Sacrament
- Ministers of the Eucharist who visit the sick and homebound should observe these same precautions.

Please remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill. It is a sign of consideration for others that those with flu-like symptoms remain at home.

These are temporary changes which are necessary to follow until the danger of flu season is passed.
