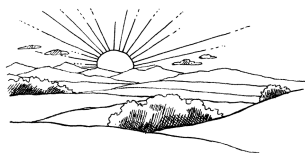
**BAPTISM:** Sundays at 12:30 pm preceded by instruction for the parents and godparents. Please call the rectory to register for classes.

# Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

January 17, 2010

Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory.  
— *Isaiah 62:2*

Dear Parishioners

We are back to 'ordinary time' by which we mean there are no big feasts like 'Christmas', with its preparatory time of 'Advent' or 'Easter with its preparatory time of 'Lent'. Ash Wednesday is on February 17. So all green vestments until then.

The first few weeks of Ordinary Time are a kind of echo of Epiphany. They reveal the identity and mission of Jesus. Last Sunday we heard John the Baptist's account of the baptism of the Lord, clearly an Epiphany theme with the theme of mission. We are all being called to carry on Christ's work. This Sunday at the wedding feast of Cana Jesus signals the beginning of his ministry.

A part of the Christian ministry is building up unity among Christians. During the week January 18<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> we are asked to pray in a special way for Christian Unity. "One obstacle to effective proclamation of the Gospel in our time is the continued separation of the Christian churches". Rowan Williams the leader of the Anglican Church made a powerful appeal in *The Tablet* for a greater unity in the name of our communion with the Lord in the Eucharist. There has been a growing convergence among the main stream churches since the Vatican Council. Methodists, Episcopalians, Catholics follow, with some small differences, the same readings every Sunday. Many Catholics share Bible studies with non-catholics. In St. Dunstan, through Peninsula Interfaith Fac-tion (P.I.A) – we cooperate with twenty five other churches/synagogues on social issues. The clergy has prayer lunches every so often. Here is the concluding paragraph from an article by Richard Gaillardetz, "An adequate account of the true catholicity of the church must go beyond an objective list of the means of salvation that ought to be present in every church. We must be willing to explore in more depth the lived experience of Christian discipleship encountered in concrete communities of believers. As many who have been involved in the ecumenical movement will testify, the experience of shared Christian discipleship often provides a fresh lens for considering the issues that divide us. To pray with other Christians, to celebrate shared commitments to the Gospel and a common determination to give witness to Christ in our daily lives is to see Christian divisions in a new light. While there is much to overcome in the work of Christian ecumenism, it is hard to imagine making any progress without the conviction that we already, in some real sense, share ecclesial communion in Christ with all who go by the name Christian."

Pray for Christian unity this week.
