Why Do Catholics Do That?

What is Canon Law? Canon Law is the official body of laws for the Catholic Church that governs faith, morals, and discipline. These laws assist the Church in carrying out her mission to the world and direct the various relationships between persons, officials and groups within the church. Only a pope or an ecumenical council has the authority to create canon law or interpret it for the universal church. The legal system of the Catholic Church is the oldest such system continually operating in the world.
